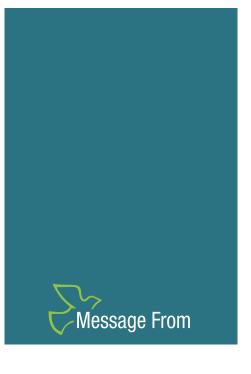

I wish the Institute all the best in its future endeavors.

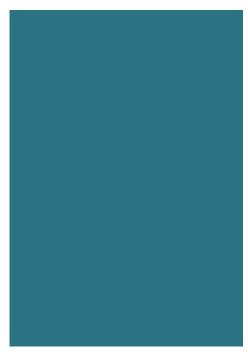

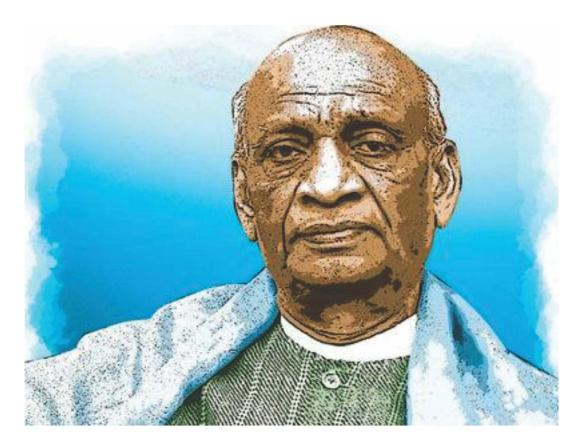

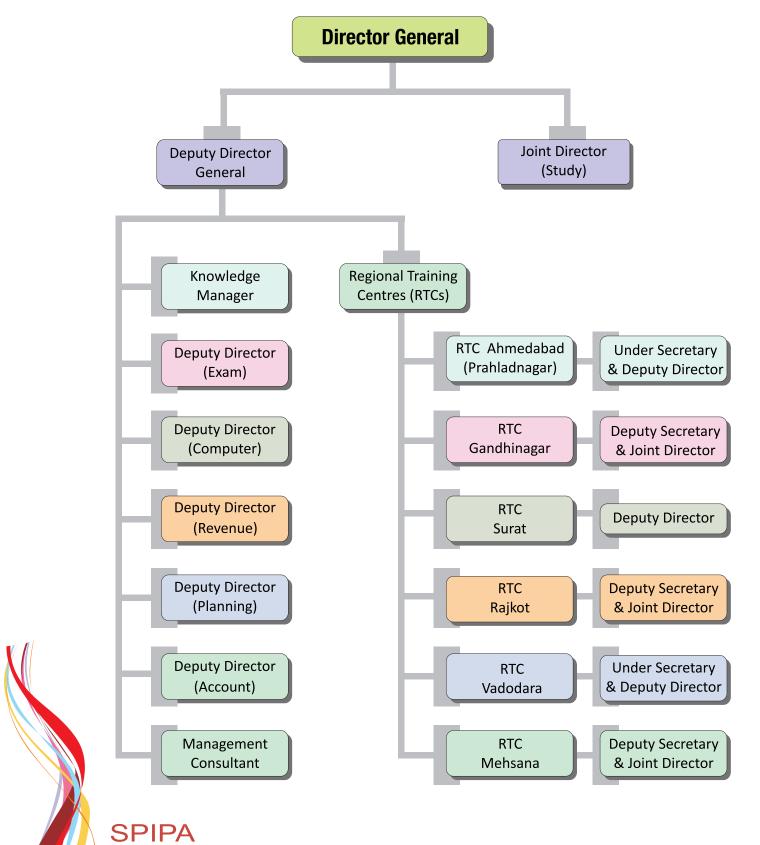

THE WINGS OF SPIPA



The Premise

For a state advancing with leaps and bounds into an era of rapid progress and development, a continual updating of skills is the sine qua non for its governing workforce. The capacity to become an instrument of change requires personal betterment and the necessary knowledge to translate vision into action. It is with this mandate that SPIPA has chalked out a multitude of training programs, in order to equip government functionaries to serve the citizens to their utmost satisfaction. It also undertakes research and surveys in its Centre for Good Governance and State Institute of Rural Development.

Wings of SPIPA

SPIPA, as the apex training institute, has set up various dedicated centres within its organization.



Civil Service Study Centre

I o fulfil the government's objective of driving the state's youth towards a career in the civil services, SPIPA's Civil Service Study Centre imparts comprehensive training to the youth of Gujarat who aspire to succeed in the highly competitive UPSC exam and join the civil services, be it the IAS, IPS, IFS, IRS etc. For this, SPIPA lays a host of facilities at their disposal: expert faculty equipped to train the aspirants to clear all three levels of the exam, a well stocked library containing all relevant study material and publications, exclusive and dedicated Reading Rooms open round-the-clock, financial aid for meritorious students from economically weaker backgrounds, comfortable accommodation at reasonable rates, a serene and tranquil campus, accommodation in Gujarat Bhavan, New Delhi for candidates appearing for the interview, etc.

State Institute of Rural Development

I he State Institute for Rural Development (SIRD) has emerged as a Centre of Excellence in Panchayati Raj and Rural Development, providing specific training programs for development at the grassroots. The task of the SIRD is to facilitate the efforts of the Government in the rural development sector by improving the knowledge, skills and attitudes through trainings, workshops and seminars. The SIRD also does detailed analysis of the best practices and innovations to ensure that these can be studied, replicated and put to use. The SIRD also does research and documentation on various projects.



Centre For Good Governance

The Gujarat Centre for Good Governance is a unit within SPIPA engaged in research, evaluation, documentation and training. It strives to promote the spirit of public service and skill up-gradation through constant monitoring. Given the diversities within our country, challenges in governance and public administration are bound to increase manifold. SPIPA conducts skill development programs for government officials at various levels. These programs focus on up-skilling and morale boosting of the officials. Research and documentation is also conducted in the Centre for Good Governance in projects sponsored by the State Government, Government of India and other organizations.

In addition, SPIPA works through its six Regional Centres situated at Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Rajkot, Surat, Mehsana and Gandhinagar. The six Regional Centres undertake the following activities:

- Pre Service Training for Clerks and training for Peons for Promotion to Class III
- Training for Secretariat Staff (Class II and III) in Departmental Proceedings
- Training in Reservation Policy, Roster Operation, Government Purchase etc. for Class III officials
- Program on Office Systems for Class IV Staff
- On Demand programs for Boards and Corporations and Government Departments.
- EDP programs for Class III officials
- Customized programs as and when demanded

The other training and development programs undertaken at SPIPA include:

Foundation Courses

Foundation courses are arranged for direct recruit officers to orient them for their new duties. The underlying aim is to educate them in government laws, rules and regulations, policies and functioning, as also to foster greater cooperation and co-ordination among various categories of officers by building an environment of togetherness and team spirit. These programs are offered to IAS, GAS Class-1, Mamlatdar, Taluka Development Officers, Accounts cadre officers and gazetted officers of various departments such as Sachivalaya cadre, Agriculture, Cooperation etc. It is mandatory for the entry level officers to undergo this training.







EDPs (Executive Development Programs)

In order to excel at work, it is necessary to be physically and mentally healthy and sport an optimistic attitude. It is also important to be abreast of the times. SPIPA offers 'soft skills' courses to help government officials enhance their personality and deal with their duties in a more positive way. The aim is to develop an efficient and vibrant public administration system by instilling its executives with skills of professionalism, the ability to cope with change and efficient workplace management.

CCC + Training

The Government of Gujarat has made the Certificate Course on Computer Concepts (CCC+) training compulsory for its officers to remain at par with changing trends in Information Technology. In order to expose government officials to the latest in the field of Information & Communications Technology (ICT), SPIPA offers training in CCC+, GSWAN and other computer related programs. These courses are aimed at enhancing organizational efficiency by making optimum use of information technology and computers.

Government Of India Sponsored Programs

Sponsored by various departments of the Government of India, such as the Department of Personnel & Training, Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances, Ministry of Panchayati Raj, Ministry of Rural Development and the Ministry of Urban Development, these programs are in the nature of in-service training and cater to multiple needs of government officials. Personality development, stress management, management of change etc. are some of the important topics addressed under these courses.



Customized Training Programs

SPIPA offers tailor made training courses, seminars and workshops to meet the specific requirements of government offices. The programs are designed after a preliminary training needs analysis, jointly conducted by the department/office concerned and representatives of SPIPA. The underlying idea behind this endeavor is to help each department realize its full potential through targeted inputs. Private Banks, NGOs, and private institutions can also avail these specialized programs.

Training In Effectively Implementing The RTI Act

This training program for capacity building of government officers as information providers has been devised for realizing the spirit of the Right to Information Act, 2005. SPIPA is renowned not only within the state of Gujarat but also at the national level as a strong authority in this area. The core faculties of SPIPA are actively involved in imparting training to Public Information Officers and Appellate Authorities on various aspects of the RTI Act. The State Government gives SPIPA separate annual grant for this activity.

Departmental Exams

he State Government has notified SPIPA as the institution for conducting departmental examinations. These examinations fall under three major categories:

- Pre-service examinations as part of training of directly recruited gazetted officers
- Departmental exams for promotions
- Exams for CCC+

In addition, SPIPA also conducts examinations for many government offices for their recruitment purposes.







SPIPA has carried out its principal activities through its 12 branches and 6 Regional Training Centres situated in Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, Vadodara, Surat, Rajkot and Mehsana. SPIPA works on the principle of increasing its attention to the training of officials who are to perform administrative functions in public 'interest'.

Management Consultant Branch

Management Consultant branch works as per Government of India guidelines providing several training programs in areas of Basic Administration, Ethics and Values for Public Governance, Life after Retirement etc. during the year 2013-14. 20 training programs of Government of India were organized in which total 534 officers participated in these programs. These training programs were conducted for state government Class 1 and Class 2 officers

from various departments such as Animal Husbandry, Education, ESIS, Panchayat, Statistics and Bureau, Agriculture etc.

The branch successfully organized 2 week special training program for Institute of Secretariat Training and Management (ISTM) for 35 secretaries of Government of India. The branch also organized national level program for National Academy of Indian Railways (NAIR).



2 Research Branch

During the 2013-14, 145 RTI Act related training were conducted in which 9774 trainees were trained.

The Research branch organized RTI workshops at district and taluka level during the year. In these programs PIO/ APIO / AA of Gujarat Government as well as public representatives were trained and study material was also distributed to them for creating awareness about the RTI Act. The branch also initiated reaching out to people through print media and 11 advertisements were published in Gujarati and English newspapers to spread and promote RTI Act 2005. 20,000 pocket books (for guidance only) on RTI Act 2005 have been printed for trainees.

The branch also organized 1 Day RTI workshop for employees of various government departments, officers of Finance Department, Gujarat Vidhansabha, GMDC, Gujarat Tourism Corporation, Uttar Gujarat Vij Company Limited and Paschim Gujarat Vij Company Limited, Municipal Corporation of Surat, Vadaodara and Ahmedabad, Medical College of Bhavnagar etc.

1 day RTI Awareness Training was organized for students of different colleges.

The branch also organized 6 GOI training programs on various subjects including Positive attitude and Positive thinking, Team Building and Motivation, Man and Time Management. A workshop was arranged at SPIPA in May 2013, chaired by Mr. Manoj Joshi, Joint Secretary, Department of Personnel and Training, Government of India in which 32 government officials from different departments of state and representatives of NGOs participated.

The branch had also organized training programs for probationer officers for IES and IAS.





3 Establishment Branch

SPIPA possesses a very well-conceived and requisitely constructed infrastructure. SPIPA, with its infrastructural facilities and lush green flora and fauna enlivens the atmosphere, thus creating a perfect academic ambience. The infrastructure work of SPIPA is separately carried out under the establishment branch. The Establishment Branch works on infrastructure up-gradation and upkeeping, other services like appointments, transfers, promotions, pay fixations, allowance and reimbursement, maintenance of various registers like

muster, leave, issues related to court and legal matters etc.

During this year, this branch undertook the activity of renovating 24 hostel rooms, thus creating rooms with latest and modern facilities. The renovation work is entrusted to famous organization in Architecture sector, CEPT University. Construction of 2 airconditioned rooms for students preparing for civil service examinations was also undertaken by this branch.









4 Examination Branch

The Examination Branch is an indivisible and distinct organ of SPIPA which effectively organizes different types of exams and conducts various training programs sponsored by GOI and GOG. Apart from the regular exams, this branch also conducts examinations for other Government offices / Boards / Corporations on payment basis. All stake holders recognize SPIPA as a reliable and efficient agency for conducting examinations.

SPIPA accepted the challenge of conducting competitive exams for Direct Recruitment of Class-III employees in various government departments/corporations. The process was initiated in May 2012 with 656 applicants and by the year 2013-14, SPIPA had conducted 45 competitive exams for different cadres of government offices/corporations with 34045 candidates. Offices like Commissioner of

Fisheries, Gandhinagar Municipal Corporation, GRIMCO, Commissioner of Geology and Mining, D-SAG, Director of Libraries and Gujarat State Tribal Development Residential Educational Institutional School have entrusted SPIPA with the responsibility for conducting the competitive exams. For the competitive examinations, the question papers are set according to the requirement of concerned department/offices. After completion of examination, the result is generated as per merit and seat number and sent to the concerned department/offices within seven to ten days of conducting the examination. The branch had conducted all these competitive examinations effectively within a short time span. Apart from helping the government fill up the vacant posts by conducting exams, it also generates considerable revenue for the institute.







SPIPA is the examining body for holding departmental examinations which fall under 4 categories:

- Pre-Service/Departmental exam for Gazetted officers and Class III employees
- Tailor made departmental exams for Ш government employees
- Ш Exams for CCC+
- Competitive exams

It is also the examining body for holding pre-service training and departmental examination for promotions. During 2013-14, the branch conducted 11 pre-service and departmental exams in which 1697 employees appeared. The branch also conducted 6 pre-service and departmental exams during 2013-14 for 518 candidates. The pre-service exams were conducted for class IV employees of secretariat/other than secretariat offices/panchayat department for promotion.

The branch co-ordinates and monitors all the Regional Training Centres for conducting departmental examination and pre service training for class III and class IV employees of non-secretariat cadres and panchayat services.

The branch also conducted 63 CCC+ exams in which 7280 employees appeared out of which 4418 candidates cleared the exam.





5 Computer Branch



In year 2013-14 the computer branch organized various training programs as below:

- CCC+ Training Programs
- II Computer Security Awareness
- III Project Management
- IV Training Programs for Central Election Commission

A total of 38 training programs were conducted by the branch, thus training 1469 participants. 17 CCC+ training programs were conducted each of 12 days. A Project Management training was organized covering 22 man-days in year 2013-14. For Central Election Commission, 15 various programs were also conducted.

The branch also started a new training Program named 'Computer Security Awareness' for secured computing and providing knowledge of the Information Technology.

The branch installed Video Conferencing facility at SPIPA and 4 other Regional Training Centres at Rajkot, Surat, Vadodara and Ahmedabad. This will help to live telecast lectures from SPIPA to other regional centres. This live telecast training was started from 12th December, 2013.

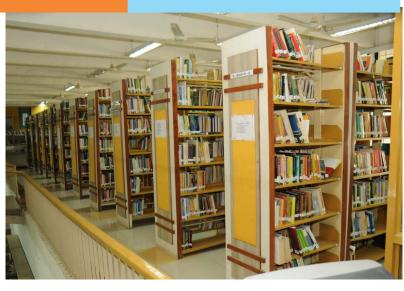
Computer branch successfully revamped SPIPA's website in year 2013 -14. It also created it presence on Facebook, Twitter and YouTube for reaching out to masses. Installation of Wi-Fi in campus area was also carried out.



6 Library : The knowledge factory

SPIPA has 1424 library members including general members, staff members, government officers and IAS study centre and CGRS students. SPIPA library has a collection of 50,163 books, 80,000 government publications and text books, 108 journals, magazines and 18 newspapers in 3 languages, 66 CDs and 66 audio cassettes.

SPIPA library is spread over approximately 5165.41 sq. ft. space. The library has collection of Print, Digital and media resources of public administration, rural development, local self-government, disaster management, humanities and social science to fulfill teaching, learning and the administrative needs of the institute. Library manages its database using SOUL 2.0 software.



The library also provides internet and computer system to users for web browsing and accessing eresources subscribed by the library.

SPIPA publishes a bi-monthly newsletter 'Gyandeep' which provides insights into activities undertaken at SPIPA and other training institutes of the state. The inhouse journal 'Nirnay' is also published bi-annually which consists of articles from practitioners, academicians and experts in their respective field for the specific theme selected for each issue.





Hostel



The SPIPA hostel gives accommodation to the trainees and students providing enabling environment for learning and repose. The hostel is managed by competent staff and they are known for their hospitality and care provided to occupants. SPIPA has two hostels, one is Men's hostel which consists of 84 Rooms and the other one is for Women which consists of 15 Rooms. Hostel building has two dining halls i.e. VIP dining hall with 40 person capacity and general dining hall with a capacity of 90 persons at a time. The hostel dining hall plays important role in terms of hospitality & reception. Occasions like New Year day, Republic day, Independence Day and Farewell of staff members are celebrated at SPIPA and hostel plays vital role at such instances.

It also has two gymnasiums with latest equipments and a trainer who helps participants maintain their diet plan and health. Indoor sports facilities like table tennis, carom etc. are also available.









8 Accounts Branch

The Accounts branch conducted various training programs on rules and regulations of the subject related to accounts and administration. During this year, 8 Executive Development Program trainings were conducted on different subjects and 5 customized programs on e-procurement were conducted by the branch. The branch also conducted Foundation Training of 45-60 days for newly recruited government officers. Under this program, total 263 trainees were trained in 5 batches. Officers of Horticulture department, Agriculture

department and Employment and Training department participated in these training programs.

Accounts branch also conducted one customized training program for MD/Directors working on board of PSUs of the state. In this program, subjects like Company Law, Annual Accounts, Listing of companies, provisions related to Audit, Income Tax/Corporate Tax, Borrowing and government guarantee and roles and responsibilities of Directors were covered.



9 SPIPA IAS Study Centre



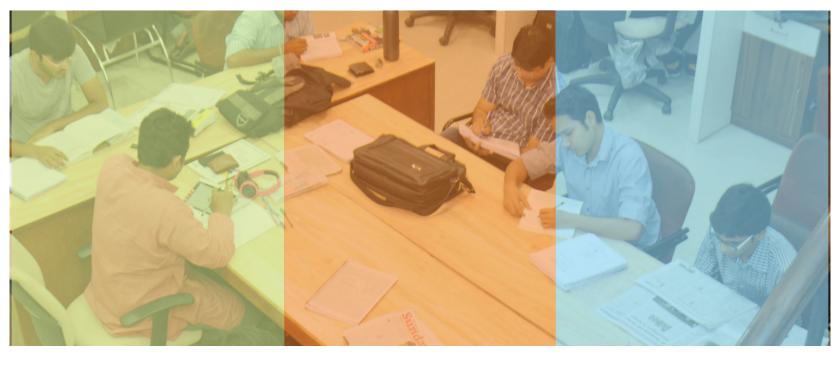
Gujarat is the state of Entrepreneurs and a small number of young talent aspire to take Public Administration as a career. In 1992, Sardar Patel Institute of Public Administration took lead in training the youth of Gujarat who aspire to join Civil Services like IAS, IPS, IFS, etc. SPIPA offers full time training for the preparation for UPSC Civil Services Examinations.

There are 2 programs running under the IAS Study Centre:

- 1. Orientation program for UPSC Civil Services Examination (On-campus & Off-campus)
- 2. Preparation Program for UPSC Civil Services Examination

The facilities provided by SPIPA for these students include training under experts and experienced faculty; library with all necessary materials like books, publication and electronic material for preparation and reading rooms with all facilities SPIPA also provides financial assistance to the students who belong to families of low income group. In addition,





SPIPA provides comfortable accommodation facility to every student at a negligible cost.

The study centre has gained popularity over the years and has strengthened itself over the last two decades. The centre has received a total of 10,424 applications so far and more than 100 candidates have been selected in civil services from the centre.

This year, SPIPA took new initiative in providing training through video conferencing to candidates at the regional training centres across the state.

The SPIPA IAS study centre conducted orientation course (on-campus and off-campus) during the year for the students to provide them information, awareness and motivation to take up the Civil Services Examinations. The course is free of cost for all the participants. The centre also reached out to participants through Satellite Communication in association with Bhaskaracharya Institute for Space Applications and Geo-Information (BISAG).

BISAG provides specialized services and solutions in implementing map-based Geospatial Information System. BISAG undertakes all services for the entire process of implementing an enterprise level GIS system. These services includes GIS database design and development, map creation/updating and finishing, data migration/conversion and format translation, software development and customization, system integration and technical consulting.

BISAG also provides complete GIS solutions which bundle hardware and software with GIS system development services.

BISAG offers comprehensive GIS/PHOTOGRAMMETRIC solutions over large geographical areas. These include solutions and services in the areas of mapping, cartography, imaging, photogrammetry and utility/environment resource management. BISAG provides solutions based on Remote Sensing using multi-spectral data, for specific applications like agricultural crop monitoring, watershed management, forest fire mapping etc.

So, through satellite communication (Sat-Com) in BISAG, SPIPA arranged lectures by which nearly 75,000 participants benefited.

During the year 2013-14, the centre conducted orientation course as follows:

10 Executive Development Program (EDP) Branch

SPIPA has been incessantly working towards development and knowledge up-gradation of government employees in the state. The EDP branch provides training to government officers and employees on various subjects including speedy service delivery, court procedure and handling litigations, roster policy and implementation of programs etc. The courses were sponsored by the state government of Gujarat and central government of India. All the programs were successfully organized and SPIPA provided excellent facilities including expert faculty, training material and exposure during the programs.

In September 2013, SPIPA organized a seminar on mid-career interaction between armed and civil services officers on "Cyber Security and Crime". In this seminar, 31 participants participated from armed police officers and civil service officers.

As per the guidelines of Indian government, EDP branch made the plan of National Training Policy, 2012 and submitted it to the Government of Gujarat.







11 Centre for Good Governance

Good Governance is one of the main objectives of SPIPA right from its inception. Under growing diversities and challenges that the governance and public administration face in current context, SPIPA's Centre for Good Governance makes continuous efforts towards improving governance and public administration and instill a feeling of proactive governance. The centre established in 2006, has strived to promote spirit of social service and boost the morale of government officials with the efforts of skill up-gradation, capacity building etc. It has conducted various training programs, workshops and seminars to promote good governance in the state.

This centre is engaged in providing training at all levels of the governance, conducts research, evaluation and documentation of projects sponsored by the State Government, Central Government and other reputed institutions and organizations.

The various important programs conducted by the centre during 2013-14 as follows:

Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) Training Programs Under National PPP Capacity Building Program (NPCBP): Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) are seen by Central Government and State Governments as a critical pillar in their strategy for improving services in infrastructure sectors including social infrastructure like health and education. Keeping this in view, Department of Economic Affairs has developed the National PPP Capacity Building

Program (NPCBP). SPIPA had tied up with IDFC, New Delhi to conduct PPP programs in different nagarpalikas of the state for officials having little or no experience of undertaking PPPs under the scheme of NPCBP. SPIPA organized eight programs on awareness and sensitization course. The courses were aimed at enhancing the target participants' overall understanding of PPPs.

- Human Development Training Program: SPIPA conducted programs on Human Development (HD) this year in the months of July 2013 and March 2014. The program was conducted for the Engineers, Doctors, Officers of Government of Gujarat of various departments/organizations like R and B, ESIS, Sardar Sarovar Narmada Nigam Ltd., SRTC (Walmi), District Panchayat, Central Design Organization etc. It was aimed at overall development of human being and the training modules were designed to suit the current scenario of human development so that participants can easily understand the content and remain updated as well. Extensive use of techniques like group discussions, brainstorming sessions and class exercises was highly appreciated by the participants as these activities gave them practical orientation of the course. The motivational videos taught them important lessons of life.
- WTO Seminar on "Negotiations in Agriculture and Non-Agricultural Market Access (NAMA)": SPIPA was

declared as the nodal institute in the state on WTO and FTA related matters by Government of Gujarat on 30th April, 2012. As a nodal institute, SPIPA is responsible for conducting research and organizing seminars/training programs/workshops on trade related matters relevant to the state. To fulfil the above responsibility, a WTO seminar on 'Negotiations in Agriculture and Non-Agricultural Market Access (NAMA)' was organized this year in collaboration with FICCI - Gujarat State Council and Centre for WTO Studies, IIFT, New Delhi. The seminar had participants from Government of Gujarat, Agricultural Universities, private corporate sector, consultants and journalists. The aim of the seminar was to acquaint the stakeholders including policy-makers in government with the theory and practice of WTO Negotiations in Agriculture and Non-Agricultural Market Access (NAMA), disputes and solutions in trade of agricultural products, tariff structures in agriculture etc. that are in place. The seminar gave first-hand exposure to the theory and practice of WTO negotiations.

• Projects in Collaboration with FICCI: Based on the inputs received during the Seminar "Impact of WTO and FTAs on Gujarat" held in 2012, two projects namely 1) Compilation of data on industry/product-wise associations/trade bodies in the state in agriculture, industry and service sectors and 2) Prepare a list of WTO related incentive schemes of the State Government had been undertaken by SPIPA in the FY 2012-13 and were assigned to FICCI. The first Project has been completed this year and second is under process and expected to get completed during first quarter of FY 2014-15.

- JnNURM Program: SPIPA, in association with IDFC organized training program to address the supply side of capacity building needs of Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) and parastatal agencies across all cities under Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JnNURM). Training was imparted to the employees of Nagarpalikas and Municipal Corporations across the state for their skill building in areas of Financial Management and Public Private Partnership.
- Workshop in Collaboration with CIPS, Hyderabad: SPIPA has entered into MoU with Centre for Innovations in Public Systems (CIPS), Hyderabad to promote innovative culture for transforming creative ideas into sustainable practices. The aim is to disseminate knowledge of new ventures and best practices in administration along with diffusion of innovations in the areas of education, health, egovernance and urban governance. In line with this mandate, SPIPA conducted one workshop on "Innovative Practices on Health" participated by government doctors and officials of health sector.
- Lecture Discussion with US Consul General, Mumbai: SPIPA conducted a lecture discussion on the subject "U.S. India – Economic Relations and Bilateral Trade" at the institute during which Mr. Peter Haas, US Consul General in Mumbai, addressed issues including trade relations between both countries and provided new dimensions towards exploring and strengthening the bilateral relations between US and India.
- Kisan-e-Setu Project: The project, 'Kisan-e-Setu', is an organized wireless internet-based solution for farmers. Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pension, Department of Administrative



Reforms and Public Grievances, Gol, New Delhi sponsored documentation of "Kisan-e-Setu - Reaping an Innovative 'Agro-E-Link' for Farmers" Project under CBPR Program. SPIPA had completed the task of documenting this project during the year. The report documents the

process of how to use Information Technology in the field of agriculture and thus gain information related to crop management. In the long run, this would help farmers to achieve economic sustainability and reduce crop failure in absence of adequate and timely information.



12 State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD)

The State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD) is the state apex body for Training, Research and Consultancy functions in the Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Department. It works as an autonomous organization under the Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Department of Government of Gujarat.

Mission: SIRD serves its mission to impart training on multi-faceted disciplines namely Rural Development, Panchayati Raj, Human Resources Development, Poverty Alleviation, Women Empowerment, Watershed Development, Decentralized Planning, Consumer Protection and Human rights to State Officials, Peoples representatives, NGOs and Panchayati Raj Institution Personnel.

State Institute of Rural Development undertakes research and project works:

- To evolve idas and concepts appropriate for rural development activities and to formulate policy alternatives.
- To bring about development in the sphere of appropriate technology for strengthening the qualitative aspects of the production of rural artisans.
- To create an awareness of the potentialities of modern management service as a major instrument for rural development.
- To take up such other programs incidental to rural development as may be found necessary from time to time

SIRD undertook more than 1100 training programs during 2013-14, in the areas of Watershed Development, Livelihood Promotion, MNREGA, Use of Technology for Rural Development, Effective





delivery by Panchayati Raj Institutions and PESA. Details of the various training programs provided during the year are given below:

- Trainings for Watershed Development Team (WDTs): 9 different kinds of training programs were designed and completed for WDTs on various subjects like Basic Training Course in Integrated Watershed Management Program (IWMP), Behavioral Aspects in IWMP, Account and Record Keeping in IWMP and Training of Trainers & Master Trainers. The design of the training program included field visits to orient participants on watershed technical & non-technical aspects of IWMP, Promotion of Agriculture based livelihoods and practical experience on conducting Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA). The trainings were participated by agriculturists, community mobilizers, engineers, data entry operators and accountants working in the WDT.
- Training for officers of Indira Awaas Yojana (IAY) and Gujarat Livelihoods Promotion Company (GLPC): Core faculty - Plant Science handles mainly training programs for Indira Awaas Yojna and Gujarat livelihood Promotion Company.

The trainings for GLPC included:

- Alignment of Mission Mangalam Yojna and NRLM
- ▶ Induction Training for officers of GLPC
- ▶ Training for GLPC staff on SHG concept & management, Micro finance, Agriculture and Animal husbandry, Cottage & Rural services
- ► Administrative Trainings on Government Procedure, Finance Management, RTI & LAQs
- ► Soft skill Trainings including team building & leadership & time management
- ▶ Technical Training for housing construction

- with disaster resistance measures
- Administrative training for Administration and Accounts Procedures

All the trainings are conducted with training modules prepared by SIRD in vernacular language. Various modules prepared are as follows:

- (2) NRLM Training material for bank linkages and management
- (3) Module for Cluster Resource Persons on "SHG concept and management"

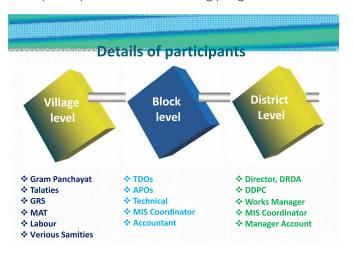
The participants for the above training programs included State, District, Block, Cluster (NRLM Cluster coordinator and Cluster resource persons) and Village community (Shramyogi).

• Training programs under The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, 2005 (MGNREGA): The mandate of the MGNREGA Act is to provide at least 100 days of guaranteed wage employment in a financial year to every rural household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work. There are two types of implementers in the MGNREGS. One is the Technical and the other is the Administrative & Accounting. SIRD conducted trainings for both the groups; For technical we included training on civil construction related subjects like preparation of estimates for the work, technical sanctions, execution of work, supervision of work, and



preparing bills for payment. The training programs included class room and field based inputs. Other important part of MGNREGA is the Administrative and Accounting and training on subjects like capacity building and awareness generation, planning for annual action plan and preparation of labour budget, payments of wage, record maintenance, management information systems (MIS), transparency and accountability including social audit and partnership with civil societies. The pedagogy included group discussions, role play, film shows, simulation games and case studies.

The participants in these training programs included:

- (4) E-Panchayat: In E-Panchayat 11 applications were used to train people to bring decentralization, accountability and transparency in the functioning of Panchayati Raj Institutions. After preparing a successful module including all applications, Regional Trainings on these applications were conducted, Master Trainers were trained as well as ToT were organized. These applications were already launched but they were not implemented effectively so far. During these trainings theoretical as well as practical knowledge was provided to participants. An input for policy level implementation of software was made during the trainings. The valid suggestions after the discussion of faculties and all the participants were forwarded to GOI though state for making software easy and for its efficient functioning. Gandhinagar and Ahmedabad districts were chosen for PRIA Soft and Plan Plus & Action Soft respectively as pilot projects. District, block and village level officers and technical persons were trained by SIRD at field level in their respective Gram Panchayat office. The trainings included:

- Training programs under Basic Computer Application Course for elected representatives: The Main objective of this training program was to train participants to know basic features about computers, its various parts and the importance of typing and saving the documents. The training on basic computer skills to Elected Representatives included following topics
 - ▶ Introduction To Computers
 - ▶ What is Computer?
 - Different Parts of computers
 - ▶ Introduction to Windows
 - ▶ Microsoft Word
 - ▶ Microsoft PowerPoint
 - ▶ Internet & Email
- Training program on Geo Informatics under the guidance of NIRD: Centre for Geo Informatics Application in Rural Development is working under the guidance of NIRD, Hyderabad from 2005 at SIRD - SPIPA, Ahmedabad. The first phase of

the project was for 5 years duration from 2005 to 2009, and then extended by 5 more years from 2009 to 2013. The centre works to support Watershed Development projects by providing information through Satellite Images and set up GIS facilities at the state level. The various training programs under the centre included:

- ▶ Basic GIS Application Course
- Geo Spatial Technology for Planning, Implementation and Monitoring of MGNREGS Projects
- ▶ Basic Computer Application Course for Watershed Staff
- Workshop in SwaRsys software for IWMP

The centre provides training on use of tools and application techniques of GIS, Remote Sensing, ICT, GPS and details of Software and data relating to spatial data, planning, monitoring, and decision making. The training also includes orientation on operating methodologies and various inbuilt features to use GIS in local level planning and decision making processes of MGNREGS. The Centre provides special emphasis on use of Open Source Software so as to make the use and deployment of Geo-spatial technologies cost effective. The techniques of Digital Image Processing of Satellite data, Integration of various thematic layers, extraction of information and handholding of GPS systems are imparted during the training program.

 Training Techniques And Methods At SIRD: Training programs at SIRD are handled professionally and in a systematic way. It starts with Training need assessment, preparation of modules based on needs identified, completion of trainings with after training follow-ups and finally documentation of



- success stories and case studies. The pedagogy includes Ice-breakers, Demonstrations, Small group discussions, Plenary group discussions, Simulation, Brainstorming, Role-play, Assignment/ Exercise, Games, Film/video clips, Individual exercise, Debates, Energizers, Case studies, Quiz, Storytelling and Panel Discussions.
- Training Materials Prepared During The Year: All the trainings at SIRD are conducted with in-house prepared training modules and relevant material. Exposure Visits Organized During The Year: Study Tour of Officials of Government of Assam on PRI System in Gujarat: With a view to making Assam Panchayati Raj System better, three senior officials of Ministry of Panchayati Raj, Assam came on study tour of Gujarat to understand the successful three tier system and development work undertaken through panchayats in Gujarat State. Their meeting was held with Shree Bhupendrasinh Chudasma, Hon. Minister of Panchayati Raj, Gujarat. The Hon. Minister appreciated SIRD for making an overview of success and development of Gujarat to the people of other states. The team from Assam were taken to see E-Gram Panchayat centre in Sachivalaya and Vavol E-Gram Panchayat. They also visited Gram Panchayats of Surat District including Baben Gram Panchayat of Surat District acknowledged by the state government as one of the best Gram Panchayats in Gujarat. They visited Amul Dairy (Anand), one of the most successful co-operative model in Asia.

Additional Projects Handled By SIRD during 2013-14

- UNICEF Project for Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan: SIRD had performed noticeable achievements during first phase of the project and it carried out activities the following areas:
- Module Developmentfor Induction Training of Nirmal Dootthat included conducting Rapid TNA & series of consultations from state to grass root level.
- (2) Conducted 2 Induction Trainings for 70 Nirmal Doot for Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan to test the module at grass root level.
- (3) Validation of Training Module (Induction Training for Nirmal Doot) at State Level in presence of State head and representatives of UNICEF.
- (4) Conducted 4 Regional courses "TOT for Induction Training Course of Nirmal Doot" and trained 120 Trainers to shoulder the responsibility to carry forward this training in cascading mode.

In the second phase, following activities were undertaken:

- (1) "Hand holding Support & Monitoring during Induction Training Course of Nirmal Doot"
- (2) Training of Trainers for selected trainers "Review, Orientation & Use of IEC Tools"
- (3) Demonstrative Training for Nirmal Doot "Review, Orientation & Use of IEC Tools"
- Workshop on Capacity Building Strategy for IWMP in Gujarat: The workshop was held from 10th to 13th

September, 2013 at Environment Sanitation Centre-SUGAD, Gandhinagar. It was organized by SIRD in collaboration with NIRD and GSWMA. To achieve the broad representation and experiences from all districts, GSWMA and SIRD had collectively identified the participants for the workshop. The participants were Technical Experts, MDTs and representatives from Capacity Building Institutions.

The specific objectives of the workshop were:

- ► To develop a vision for the future capacity building program in terms of module and strategy
- ► To brainstorm ideas and issues related to the training system
- ▶ To develop a common understanding for the training system & module among CB institutions and DWDUs,
- ► To facilitate inter-learning from each other's experience on strategy, methods and tools

The workshop was structured around a series of small group discussions and plenary feedback sessions that were guided by experts. Eminent Speakers like Shri Manikant, Professional expert - GSWMA, Dr. S S P Sharma- Professor and Head, NIRD-CWLR, Shri Ramchandrudu-WASSAN, Hyderaband, Shri Hemant Pinjan - WOTR, Rajasthan, Shri Sachin Oza - Executive Director - Development Support Center, Shri Binoy Acharya- Founder Director - UNNATI and Ms. Kirtida Vora-Consultant and Trainer were share their views and draw the workshop in desired direction.

 Training program on Agri-based livelihood and Value chain: Watershed works for the rural livelihood in



which most important livelihood remains in Agriculture. How to strengthen agri-based livelihood more and what is value chain in which we can be helpful to the farmers for the betterment of their livelihood. Four days program includes the field work at market – APMC and field visit at the village based institution called Producer Company of farmers.

- Workshop on IEC development in IWMP: The workshop was organized in consultation with GSWMA to develop different kind of IEC material under IWMP. The workshop exercised the different strategy, type of IEC material and target community for three phases of IWMP i.e. preliminary phase, implementation phase and consolidation phase.
- Workshop on SWaRsys software Implementation: SWaRsys is the IWMP software for execution of Watershed project online. All DWDU of Gujarat using this software for data entry and GIS Maps. Watershed project approval to execution of the projects should be done through the online software process. SIRD had arranged workshop for above three districts in which how implementation of the projects should be done by this application and different functionality of the software was covered. Practical hands on each module of the software were done online and data entry issues related to it solve during the workshop. Workshop was arranged for 3 days with 31 participant and 93 man days.

Notable Achievements during 2013-14

 SATCOM programs for MGNREGA Act: The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act is a "People's Act" which was prepared after several consultations with civil society and to provide fundamental right to life with dignity. There is a need to build up the capacity and sensitivity of stakeholders in implementing this Act and envisioning this particular need SIRD has planned a training program through SATCOM for different stakeholders of MGNREGA with an objective to impart the skills and sensitivity of planning and implementation under MGNREGA. This training is transmitted from the studio at BISAG, Gandhinagar and received at receiving centers at DRDAs, Taluka Panchayats, BRC Bhavans and Gram Panchayats equipped with SATCOM receiving facility. The training is through an interactive media platform where participants can ask questions and clarify their doubts.

• Bharat Niraman Volunteers (BNV) motivated & trained: SIRD is nodal state level agency for flagship concept of Lab to Land Initiative & Bharat Nirman Volunteers (BNV) Strategy for Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India. We have registered 14000 plus BNVs in our state. There is no provision to give monetary benefits to volunteers for any kind of services they provide to the villagers. It is difficult to sustain their motivation to serve for long run without rewards.



SIRD has worked to overcome this constraint by offering 'Skill Development Training' for only BPL - BNVs at National Institute of Rural Development, Hyderabad. SIRD is helping District Administration for review, orientation & selection of BNVs for Skill Based Training. In 2013-14, SIRD provided exposure to 126 BPL BNVs (sponsored by SIRD) in six batches at Hyderabad to various units making soaps, herbal products, pearls jewelry, paper bags, soya products and bee keeping. This has helped raise confidence of 126 BPL volunteers for social services and have acquired knowledge to share with people back in their neighborhood.

- National level Workshop for Program Adviser Group (PAG), MGNREGS: A workshop was organized by MoRD, NIRD and SIRD with PAG to discuss ways to increase participation of vulnerable groups in the MGNREGS and the need to develop mechanisms and processes that will proactively reach out to these groups and increase their participation in the program. In light of this, it was decided that a National Resource Group on Vulnerable Groups in MGNREGA will be set up with following terms of reference:
 - Identifying barriers to inclusion, discrimination and other difficulties faced by vulnerable groups such as the aged, single women, people with disabilities, particularly vulnerable tribal groups, nomadic tribes, bonded labourers and artisan
 - Identifying changes in provisions required to ensure that vulnerable groups have access to job cards

- Drawing up a list of works that arc more inclusive of vulnerable groups'
- ▶ Identifying changes in rules, schedule of rates and other processes so as to include and support vulnerable groups to access work in MGNREGA works
- Identifying on-site and off-site services and facilities which will actively Support and encourage inclusion, well-being and protection of rights of vulnerable groups and their dependents
- ▶ Any other related matters
- Workshop on making MGNREGA effective in Gujarat: A workshop was organized by CRD, Gandhinagar and SIRD, Ahmedabad with NGOs of Gujarat on making MGNREGA effective in Gujarat. The workshop was graced by the Secretary, Rural Development Department, Additional Secretary, Rural Development Department and Director SIRD. Primary objective of the workshop was to deliberate on some of the key aspects related to implementation of MGNREGA in Gujarat and develop a strategy to involve NGOs to strengthen it.
- Workshop on Inclusion of Postal Department in E-FMS payment of MGNREGA: One state level workshop was organised for the officers of the postal departments of the State to implement the EFMS properly. EFMS was developed by government to pay the wages to labourers of MGNREGS, directly in the postal accounts and timely also to avoid the delay in payments of labourers. The workshop was organized to sensitize the officers of postal department about the intent of



MGNREGA and its alignment with E-FMS and the advantages to the poor.

The State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD)
will focus on implementation of the training

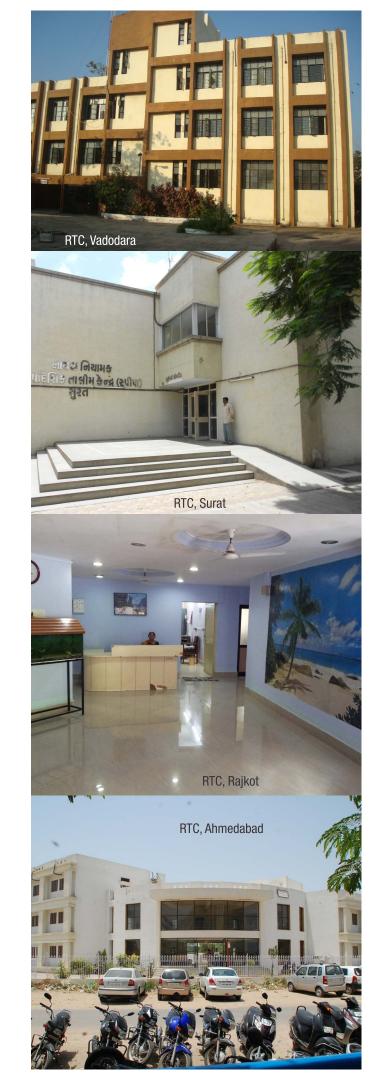
SPIPA REGIONAL TRAINING CENTRES

SPIPA has six Regional Training Centres (RTCs) which are situated at Ahmedabad (Prahladnagar), Gandhinagar, Mehsana, Rajkot, Surat and Vadodara. RTCs offer an assemblage of training programs at regional level.

The major activities of the regional training centres are as follows:

- Pre Service Training for Clerks and training for Peons for Promotion to Class III
- Training for Secretariat Staff (Class II & III)
- Training in Reservation Policy, Roster Operation, and Procurement & Purchase for Clerks & Assistants of Secretariat and Heads of Department
- Program on Office systems for Class IV Staff
- On-Demand Programs for Boards and Corporations & Government Departments







Ahmedabad Regional Training Centre:

The Regional Training Centre (RTC) at Ahmedabad is housed in a new building at prime location of Corporate Road, Prahaladnagar, Ahmedabad. The state of the art infrastructure and campus location & tranquil environment makes it suitable for trainings, research and learning. During the year, the centre trained over 1650 government employees under different training. Keeping in mind the vision of developing human capital through upgrading knowledge and skills of mainly non-Gazetted employees, RTC - Ahmedabad conducted following training classes.

Pre-Service Training Classes: At RTC in Ahmedabad Pre-service training classes are conducted for class-III and class-IV employees of State Government Offices. Employees appointed in the post of clerks, Clerk-cum-typists and those to be promoted from class-IV to Class-III employees in 5 districts viz. Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, Kheda, Anand & Mahisagar are trained at in this centre. The 2 months training is imparted by senior Lecturers and subject experts

of the training Centre. Examination oriented test are also conducted to uplift confidence level of employees so that they can appear in the exam without fear.

Administrative Development Program (EDPs Class):

Administrative Development Program conducted for Class-III & Class-IV employees. EDPs classes cover various subjects including General Administration, Office Procedure, Record Management, Stress Management, Record Management, Financial Management, Gujarat Civil Services Rules, Pension & Pensionary Benefits, Disciplinary and Conduct Rules, Purchase Procedure & Contingency Expenditure Rules, Departmental Inquiry, Budget & Planning, Service conditions -Classification & Recruitment Rules, Financial Advances & Delegation of Financial Powers, Corruption Prevention & Administrative Reforms, Pay Fixation and Gujarat Treasury Rules etc. The training is imparted by expert guest lecturers and as per Government Resolution, specific fees are charged for EDP class.



- Special Classes on "Right to Information Act-2005": Special free classes on "Right to Information Act-2005" are being conducted by RTC-Ahmedabad. There is an effort made to design and prepare study material on RTI to be given to trainees.
- Customized Training Programs: With a view to meet special training needs of a particular Govt.
 Department or Institute, RTC-Ahmedabad arranges Customized Training Programs in consultation with particular Department/Institute.

During the year, the Centre undertook several initiatives to upgrade its infra structural facilities which included installation of air-conditioners in all the classrooms, seminar halls, and offices; installation of CCTV cameras to bring the entire campus under surveillance and installation of purified water system for provision of safe drinking water.



Gandhinagar Regional Training Centre:

The RTC, Gandhinagar is also known as Secretariat Training Centre having space of 5638 square feet area. This centre is located at Dr. Jivraj Mehta Bhavan in Gandhinagar. The Centre has 3 well equipped class rooms, 2 AC class rooms with sitting facility for 50 participants per class and an AC computer lab containing 24 computers with a server. The centre has 3 LCD projectors and other audio-video facilities. There is also a well maintained library housed in the centre for use of the pre and in-service trainees. The Centre offers training covering a broad spectrum of subjects for the Class-III and IV employees.

Rajkot Regional Training Centre:

The RTC in Rajkot undertakes training for government employees working in Rajkot, Morbi, Kutch-Bhuj, Bhavnagar, Botad, Jamnagar, Devbhumi-Dwarka, Junagadh, Gir-Somnath, Surendranagar, Amreli and Porbandar. The centre is equipped with hostel facilities both for men and women, a committee hall, 2 air conditioned classrooms with capacity of 50 persons each and a computer lab with 20 work-stations. The training programmes undertaken by the centre during the vear include:



Pre-Service Training: In 2013-14, the centre conducted 5 pre service training classes training 271 participants. The centre also conducted 2-pre



service training exams in which 249 persons participated.

Computer Training (CCC+ Training and Exam): The centre conducted 16 CCC+ training classes during 2013-14 for class-I and class-II officers of Saurashtra and Kutch region. Over 300 trainees participated in the training and 1085 persons appeared for the CCC+ examination conducted by the Centre.

Civil Service Training Program: Civil service training classes were conducted for the first time at the centre and along with it 5 awareness programs were conducted in various colleges and institutions to motivate youth to apply for UPSC.

R.T.I. Awareness Program: Under RTI awareness Program, the centre conducted 15-seminars outside the institute in which total 2405 persons participated.

Surat Regional Training Centre:

This centre had conducted total 103 training during the year 2013-2014. The centre provided services to over 2198 persons in form of training and other services. The centre makes efforts to provide training and training material in vernacular language facilitated through audio-visual facilities and books.



Vadodara Regional Training Centre:

Vadodara where The Maharaja Sayajirao University is located, is the land known for excellent pursuit for education, training and enlightenment with the various training institutes in Vadodara for government, corporate and private sectors. The RTC Vadodara, a sub-centre of SPIPA caters to the need of training to the government employees serving in the seven districts of Central Gujarat, viz. Vadodara, Chhotaudepur, Bharuch, Narmada-Rajpipla, Panchmahal-Godhara, Mahisagar-Lunavada and Dahod. RTC Vadodara has one A.C. Conference room, two A.C. classrooms viz. Mahisagar and Vishvamitri and one video conference room viz. Narmada, each with the seating capacity of 30 participants. It has one A.C. computer lab with latest version of i5 computers and facilities of GSWAN & Internet, with 20.

During the year 2013-14 the centre provided training to 142 persons as part of Pre-service training, to 108 persons as part of Executive Development Program which included special Program on "Departmental Inquiry and Rules of Discipline & Appeal-1971" and on "Gujarat Civil Services Rules-2002, R.O.P. Rules & Office Procedure".

The centre also undertook GOI sponsored training in the areas including:

"Public Distribution System" for 44 trainees

"Disaster and Crisis management" for 19 trainees

"Pension and Pensionary Benefits" for 50 trainees

"Event Management" for 37 trainees

"Stay Fit and Perform Better" for 58 trainees

"Budget and Accounting Procedure" for 23 trainees

"Improvement of Work Environment" for 65 trainees

"Stress and Time Management" for 55 trainees

"Skills for Self Development" for 32 trainees

"Empowerment of Women" for 48 trainees

"Effective Meeting and Facilitation Skills" for 23 trainees



"Stress Management" for 34 trainees

"Efficient Office Management" for 59 trainees

"Communication and Presentation Skills" for 14 trainees

"Physical and Mental Fitness" for 36 trainees "In Tune With Nature" for 34 trainees

Other training at the centre included:

Training on Right to Information Act, 2005: 6 training on Right to Information Act, 2005 have been conducted in which 187 trainees.

Off-Campus Training Program under RTI Project: 2 training were conducted under RTI Project in the year 2013-14 in which 425 trainees have participated in the Program.

CCC+ Training Programs: Following the E-governance policy of Government of Gujarat, RTC, Vadodara has conducted 17 training (duration of 12 working days each) on CCC+ for 333 trainees. It has also conducted post training CCC+ examination for them.

Customized Training: RTC, Vadodara has been conducting customized training as per the requirements of various departments. In 2013-14 RTC, Vadodara has conducted total 18 customized training viz. for Research and Statistical Assistants, Sanitary Safai Sevaks of Vadodara Mahanagar Seva Sadan and training on request of Chief Election Officer, Gandhinagar.

The centre endeavors to make this institute a source of inspiration to the Govt. employees. With the training on administrative subjects, the centre also imparts training of soft-skill subjects to help the government employees become more sensitive to the needs of people, positive in attitude and professional in handling their tasks. Upgradation of "Gyanshakti" for converting in to "Karmashakti" and in that way, enhancement of "Karmashakti" of government employees and "Gyanarthe Pravesh, Sevarthe Prasthan" are the motto of this institute. All possible economic measures have been taken so that the best training is available with the less expenditure.

Mehsana Regional Training Centre:

Time Bound Training are planned and conducted for general and special administrative matters and imparted to district and taluka officials. Compulsory training classes are conducted for class 3 employees of State Govt. Offices, District Panchayat office, those appointed in the office under jurisdiction of district panchayat viz. clerks, clerk-cum-typists and those to be promoted from class 4 to class 3 employees. The centre also conducts administrative development programs and training for promotion of mukhya sevikas of district panchayats including rural housing department and employees of primary health centers. The centre also follows the policy of GoG and lays emphasis on providing reliable egovernment at the cutting edge by providing training for CCC+ to the class III & IV employees and is also conducting exams for the same.

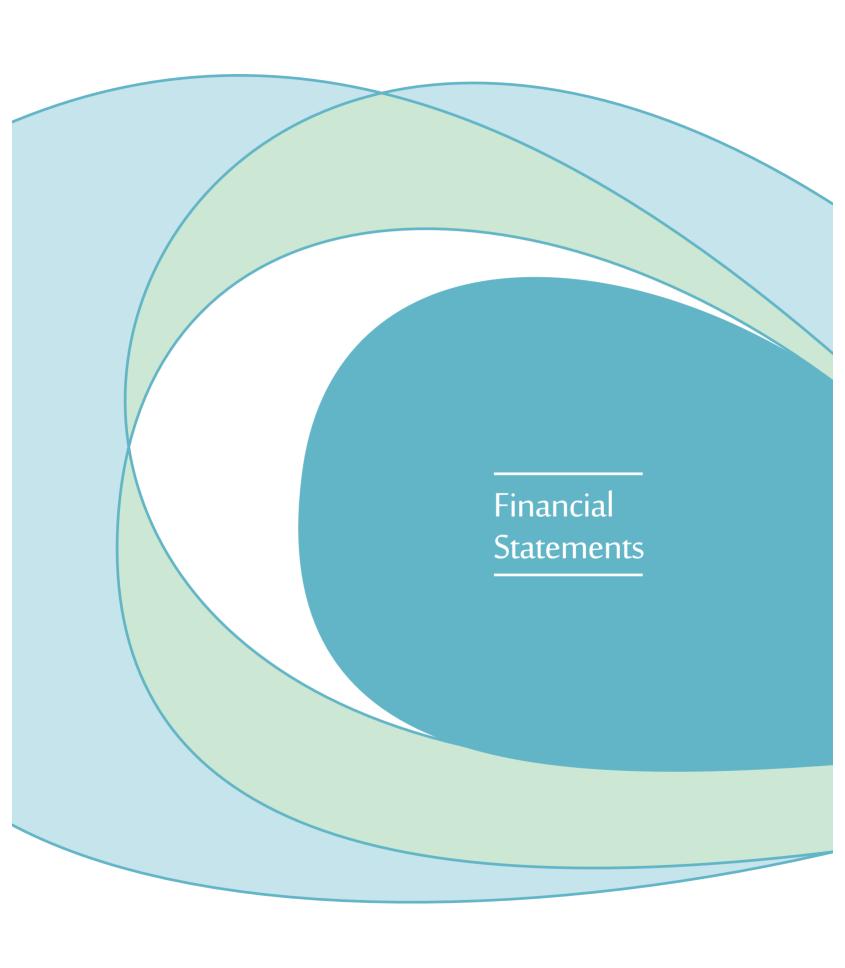
Independence Day Celebration:

Remarks:

1. In our opinion, internal control system needs to be strengthened in respect of review of

grant given to various Regional Training Centers at regular intervals.

2. The Trust has not maintained proper records showing full particulars including quantitative

details and situation of fixed assets. The Fixed Assets have been physically verified by the management during the year ended 31st March, 2013. However discrepancy and

subsequent reconciliation, between physical assets and that as per accounts is pending to

be carried out.

3. As per the accounting policy consistently followed by the trust, depreciation on fixed

assets acquired out of grant from various sources is debited to Income & Expenditure Account. However, amount equivalent to depreciation for the year has not been

transferred to Income & Expenditure Account as required under para no. 8.4 of

Accounting Standard (AS) 12 on Accounting for Government Grant issued by The Institute

of Chartered Accountants of India. The cumulative impact of the same on the balance of

Grant and accumulated balance of surplus can not be ascertained.

4. Attention is invited to note no. 4, Part B of Schedule F to the financial statement in respect

of reconciliation of difference in the bank balance amounting to ₹ 6,23,512/- in respect of

Bank Account maintained by RTC-Surat (Included in Balance with Banks). As a result of the same, effect of such difference on the surplus for the year or Assets and Liabilities as at

year-end could not be ascertained.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES ON ACCOUNTS:

A. **Significant Accounting Policies:**

1. Basis of Accounting:

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India. All income and expenditure are recognized for on accrual basis.

2. Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and reported amount of income and expenditure during the reporting period. Difference between the actual result and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known and materialized.

3. Grant received from Government:

- a) Grants received during the year for acquiring fixed assets under Plan approval is treated as other earmarked fund. The unutilized fund out of the said grant (i.e. fund received reduced by value of assets acquired) is transferred to Income & Expenditure Account.
- b) Grants received for the projects, and which is required to be refunded if the amount remains unutilized is included under the head Liabilities i.e. amount received to be utilized for specific purpose in Balance Sheet. Expenditure incurred on related projects is reduced from the balance of the said grant. However, if the assets are acquired out of the said grant, balance of the grant is not reduced out of balance of related grant and the assets are treated assets of the Trust.
- c) Grant received for Administrative Expenditure (Non Plan) is treated as revenue grant and accordingly credited to Income and Expenditure Account.
- d) Incidental income earned out of Funds lying with Bank Accounts is treated as income of the trust and accordingly credited to Income and Expenditure Account.
- Fixed assets are stated at Cost less depreciation. 4.

5. Depreciation:

a) Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on written down value method at the Following Rates:

- b) Depreciation on additions is provided as under:
 - In case off additions before 30th September @ Full rates as per above table
 - In case off additions after 30th September @ Half rates as per above table
- 6. All other accounting policies not specifically mentioned herewith above are consistent with generally accepted accounting practices.

B. Notes on Accounts

- 1. The Government of Gujarat has setup Sardar Patel Institute of Public Administration under the provisions of Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Registration No GUJ/10590/Ahmedabad) and Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 (registration no. F/13108/Ahmedabad) vide resolution no. VATABH-1804-1127/VASUTAPRA-3 w.e.f. 1st October, 2004. The Trust is also registered under Section 12AA of the Income Tax Act,1961 vide Director of Income Tax (Exemption), Ahmedabad vide their letter no. DIT(E)/12AA/604/2004-05 dated 07/07/2005 effective from 1st October, 2004.
- 2. The Trust has acquired / created all the assets out of contribution from various agencies. However the costs of Fixed Asset have been treated as assets of the trust. Accordingly,, the depreciation on the assets is charged to Income & Expenditure Account of the trust.
- 3. During the year under audit, Income tax refund amounting Rs. 13,58,340/- has been received by the trust out of the refund of earlier years. The trust do not have information in respect of the interest. In the absence of the information, the trust has adjusted entire refund against advance tax receivable. On receipt of information from Income Tax Department, the trust will pass necessary rectification entry in the books of accounts.
- 4. In respect of unidentified payment(net) of Rs 6,23,512/- out of bank balance with Bank of Baroda maintained by RTC-Surat, the trust has initiated action to reconcile the balance. On receipt of reconciliation, necessary rectification entries will be passed.
- 5. Outstanding balance as at Balance Sheet date of parties and agencies included in amount received to be utilised for specific purpose, Sundry Creditors Current Liabilities and loans and advances are subject to confirmation and subsequent reconciliation if any by the Trust.
- 6. Previous Year's figures have been regrouped wherever necessary to make them comparable with Current Year's figures.
